HEADMASTERS' ADDRESS

“Why did you choose Lendy Park School to educate your child?”

The Guest of Honour, Mr Kumbirai Dhliwayo, the Chairman of the Board Rev John Chinyowa and Mrs Chinyowa, Board Members, representatives of the Ministry of Education, the Chairperson of the Parents Association, Mrs Chenesai Mangoma and committee members, staff, parents, boys and girls: welcome.

I am honoured to stand before you today as we celebrate the achievements of our students and the dedication of our staff at the annual Speech Day and Prize Giving of Lendy Park School. Despite the challenges we have faced this year, we have persevered and emerged stronger.

The year has been filled with remarkable accomplishments. Our sports teams have showcased their skills and sportsmanship, our choirs and musicians have excelled in competitions, and our students have demonstrated their academic prowess in various examinations. We have also produced exceptional plays, enriching the cultural life of our school, while fulfilling our core mission of spreading the news of salvation offered by our loving God through Jesus Christ.

On the spiritual front, we have emphasized the importance of living a life that pleases God. Our school values, guide our decisions and influence our behaviour, and we are committed to reinforcing these values through assemblies and our Spiritual Formation Plan. These efforts will help us achieve our Expected Student Outcomes, defining the qualities we strive to instil in our pupils by the time they graduate in Grade 7. Academically, we have gradually moved towards the full adoption of the Cambridge Primary Framework to complement the ZIMSEC curriculum, preparing our children for a rapidly

The Ministry of Education's CALA initiative complements our focus on skills development, but we must ensure that these activities are meaningful and not mere box-ticking exercises. We hope that The Ministry will reduce the number of these projects to prioritize quality over quantity. By next year, the Cambridge Framework will be fully integrated into the classroom procedures for ECD to Grade 6, allowing Grade 7 to focus solely on the ZIMSEC Grade Seven Examinations.

Despite the financial challenges faced this year, we have made significant progress. With the generous support of the PA Committee, we have painted half of the school's external walls. Additionally we have managed to acquire a "new" bus aptly called Rumbidzai, planted grass, and provided textbooks for many of the classrooms.

The rebirth of the PA at the end of the first term as a vibrant community of parents dedicated to improving our school stands as the remarkable achievement of this year. Chenesai and her team have played a pivotal role in this transformation and to you I express my thanks.

I am also immensely grateful to the board of trustees, led by Pastor Chinyowa, for their steadfast guidance during this challenging year. Their unwavering commitment to providing a truly Christian education for our children is invaluable. They have generously given their time, wisdom, and personal finances to uphold the vision and mission of Lendy Park.

The goodwill that exists within the community for Lendy Park School is truly inspiring. Individuals and organizations, both parents of Lendy children and people unconnected with Lendy Park, have come forward time and again to support us: from providing grass clippings to buses and from oranges to tractors and from clay to paint. I would like to express my special gratitude to Paul Davis, a steadfast friend of Lendy Park School, as he embarks on a new chapter in his life. I also extend my heartfelt appreciation to

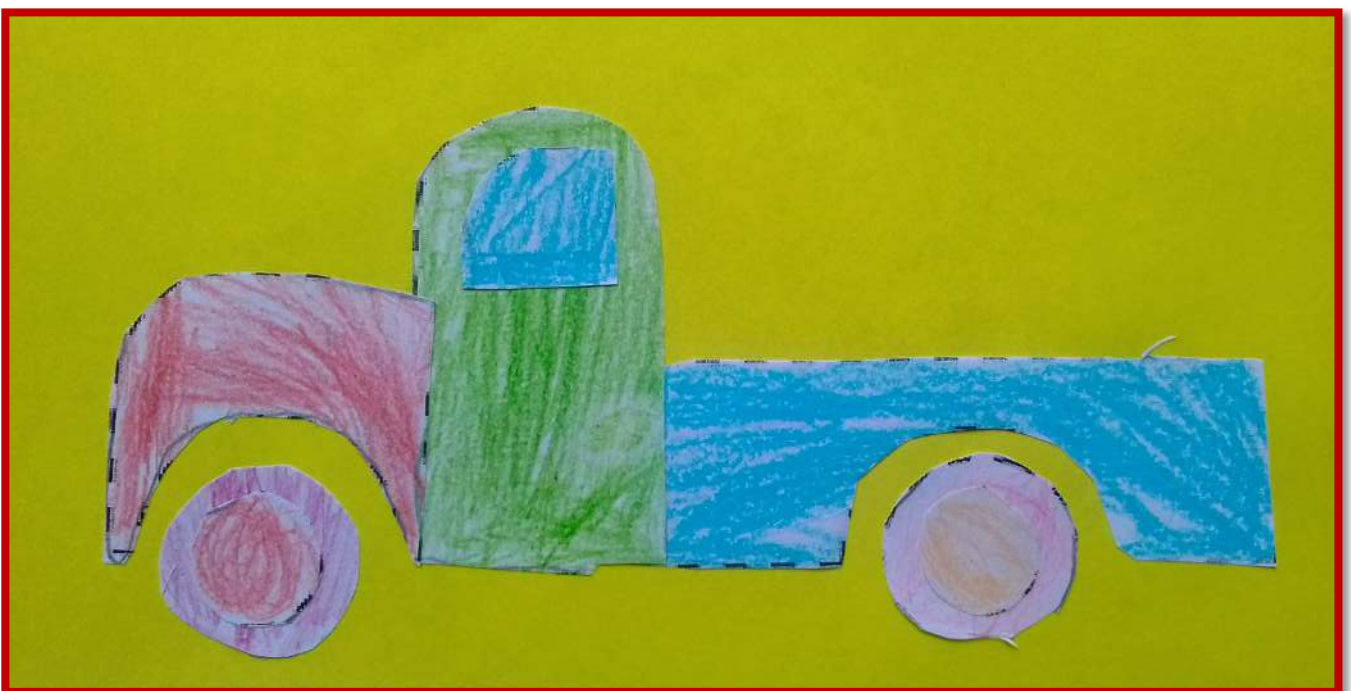
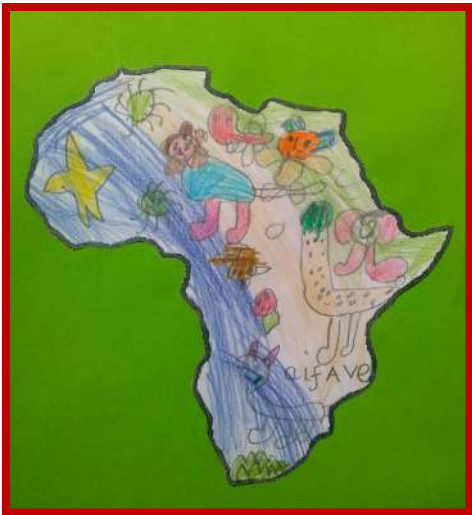


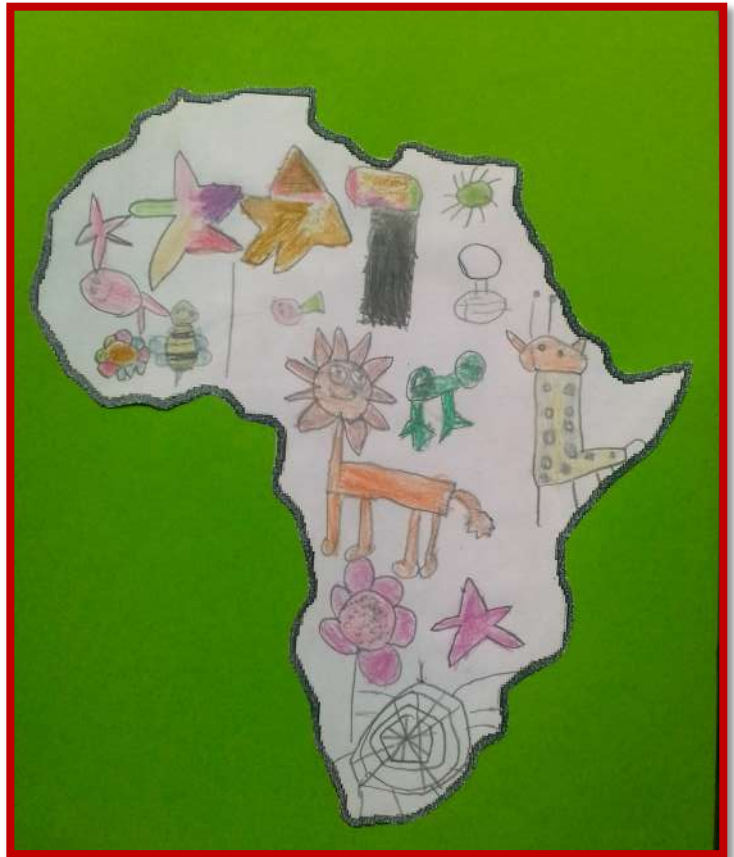

The daily devotionals and participation by the children in praying for the school, their peers, their teachers and their families has demonstrated a growing spiritual maturity.



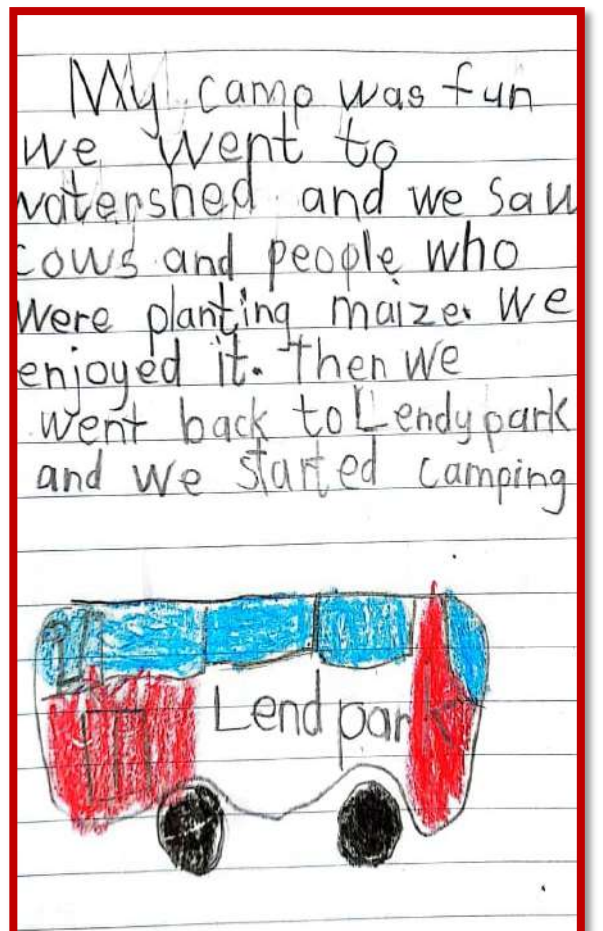
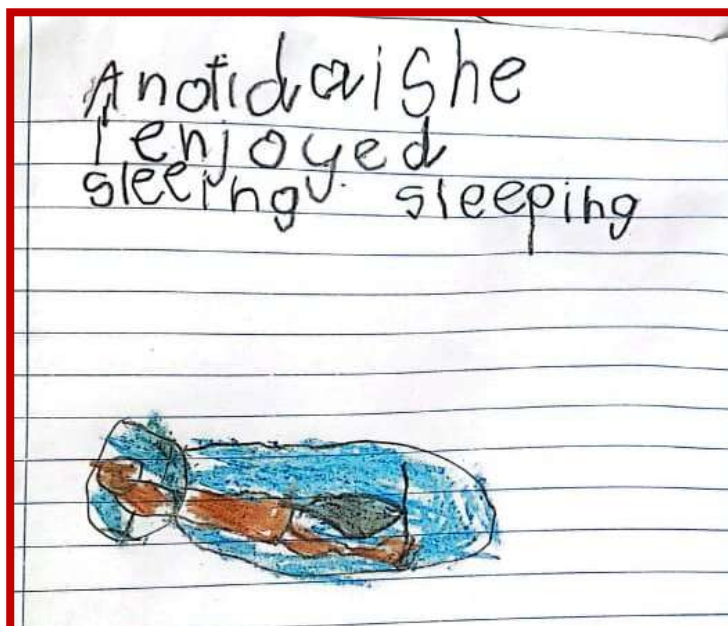
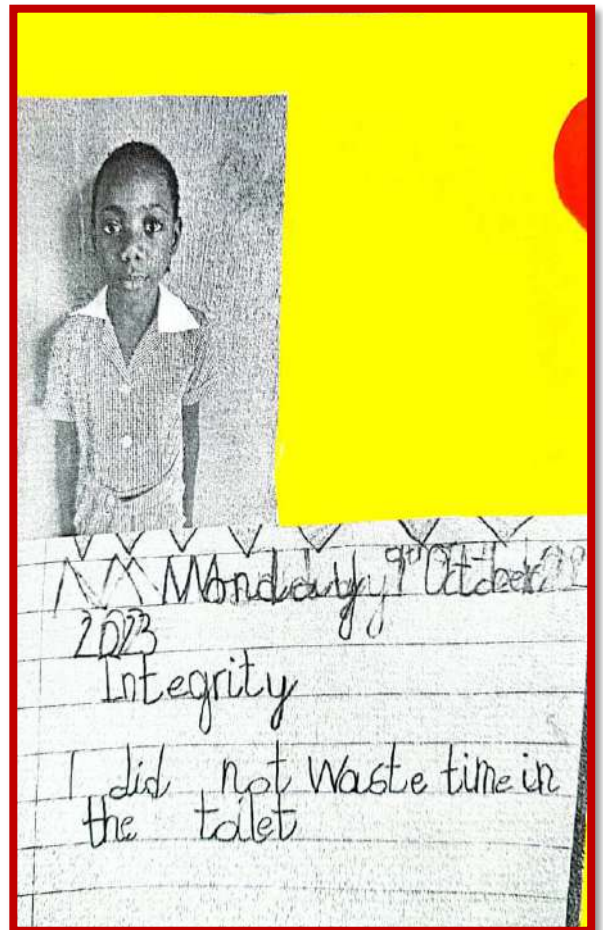
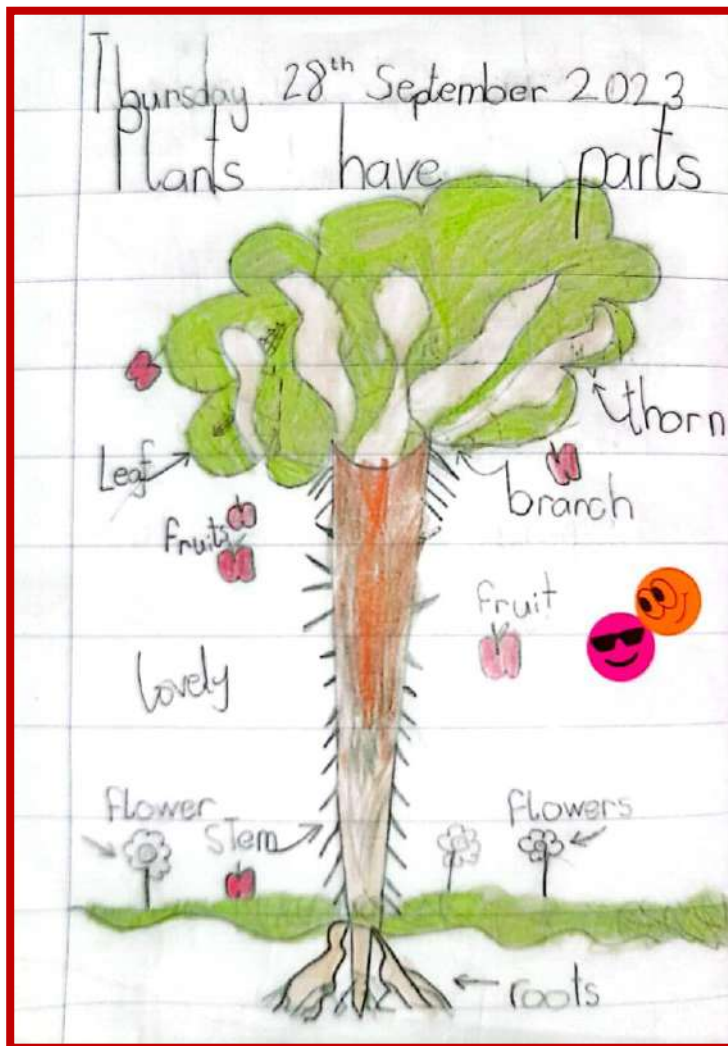


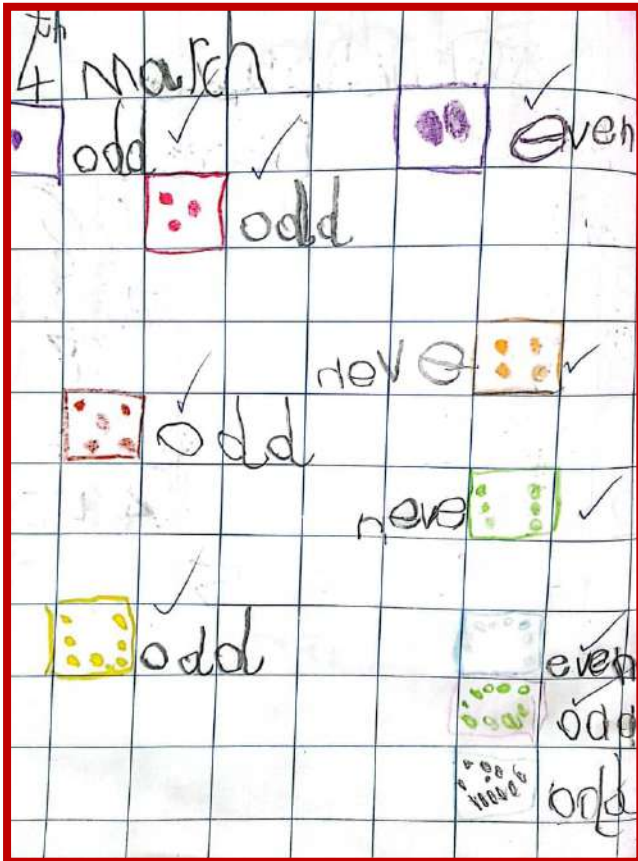

Later on, we went for a night drive and saw some owls and impalas. It was a wonderful day. -

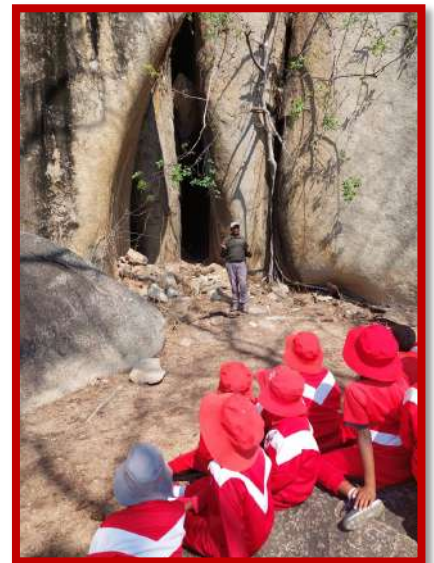

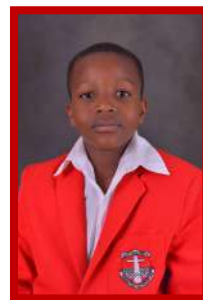
