## Lendy Park School Colours Policy

Lendy Park School acknowledges the importance of recognising exceptional talent and performance in the sporting, academic and cultural spheres of school life. This recognition is in the form of colours awards and half colours awards.

The policy for awarding colours is as follows:

## Cultural Awards:

Full Colours

- Full colours are awarded to a child who archives an Honours Award at the Allied Arts Festivals. This does not apply to awards to choirs.
- Full colours are awarded to children who achieve a first in at least three instruments or a combination of instruments and solo singing performances and is considered to have made significant contributions to the cultural department.

Half Colours:

- Half colours may be awarded for contribution to the music department over many years.


## Academic Awards:

Full Colours:

- Colours can only be awarded to Grade 7 children
- They should have worked consistently hard throughout the year, handing in all assignments, projects CALAs etc.
- They should achieve $\qquad$ points or less in the Grade 7 ZIMSEC examinations.

Half Colours:

- Half colours can only be awarded to Grade 7 children
- They should achieve $\qquad$ points or less in the Grade 7 ZIMSEC examinations.


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Sporting Awards:
Full Colours:

- The child MUST demonstrate good sportsmanship and uphold the school values on the sports field.
- Any child who achieves Provincial or National Representation.
- Colours may be awarded to children in Grade 6 and 7.
- They should be selected for Provincial Teams (including non travelling reserves).
- In the case of sports where there are no provincial teams the following applies:
- Cross-country - in the top three positions in any of the interschools competitions;
- Athletics - the child comes in the top 3 positions at an interschools competition in at least 2 events or if a senior breaks a Lendy record at inter house competitions. In Grade 6 a child may be awarded colours if they place in the top three places in at least $\mathbf{3}$ different interschools competitions.
- Swimming - the child comes in the top 3 positions at an interschools competition in at least 2 events or if a senior breaks a Lendy record at inter house competitions. In Grade 6 a child may be awarded colours if they place in the top three places in at least $\mathbf{2}$ different interschools competitions.
- Tennis and Netball - may be considered based on their performance against other teams over the course of the year.

Half Colours:

- The child MUST demonstrate good sportsmanship and uphold the school values on the sports field.
- These may only be awarded to Grade 7 children or children in Grade 6 who are overage and will not be able to compete in their Grade 7 year due to age restrictions.
- They should be selected for possible and probable squads for Provincial Teams and be considered good enough to potentially make a provincial team although they might be selected.
- In the case of sports where there are no provincial teams the following applies:
- Cross-country - in the top six positions in any of the interschools competitions;
- Athletics - the child comes in the top 3 positions at an interschools competition in at least 1 event.

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- Swimming - the child comes in the top 3 positions at an interschools competition in at least 1 event.
- Tennis and Netball - may be considered based on their performance against other teams over the course of the year.

In all cases, the child's commitment, sportsmanship and behaviour must be of a good standard.
