Leap Frog Programme

We are pleased to announce that the **Leap Frog Programme** will begin soon in our school for the two ECD classes and the Grade 1 class. In addition, Mrs Bowen will work with other children where there is a need. Our teachers will receive their training next week.

This programme seeks to address developmental deficiencies in children while they are very young and when the problems can be readily remediated: thereby reducing the chances of educational problems later in their schooling.

These developmental deficiencies can influence a child's success in a wide range of activities: from sport to academics.
