Building Foundations for Adulthood at Lendy

Last week, while weeding with the children before school, I was approached by a child in Grade 2 who initiated the following conversation:

Child: Good morning, Mr A. I know what you are doing.

Me: Oh? What am I doing?

Child: You are weeding.

Me: That's correct.

Child: I know why you are weeding.

Me: Why am I weeding?

Child: Because of our values.

Me: Oh? What do our values have to do with weeding?

Child: *Because if we didn't have values,*

you would just leave the weeds in the ground!

This moment, coupled with an incident during assembly where a boy deliberately chose to stand on the girls' side of the merit line to prevent the 'ship' from 'capsizing,' highlights something important. These interactions remind us that Lendy is not just educating your children academically; we are also instilling values that form a strong foundation for adulthood.
